Australia Awards Short Courses in Agribusiness empower participants to develop their knowledge, practical skills and networks with other government, private sector and civil society representatives from across PNG.

Graduates achieve an internationally recognised qualification and the skills to drive change and make positive contributions to PNG's development.

Short Courses include a block of study in Australia, with pre- and post-course workshops in Papua New Guinea and completion of a work-based project. There is a focus on practical skills and experience during classroom components, site visits and networking.

Work-based projects undertaken to date include improving smallholder coffee-growing and livelihoods in the Highlands, enhancing cocoa farming strategies in Bougainville and innovation in poultry production in Sandaun and the National Capital District.


